	Annette has been playing old-time tunes since 1978 and has a drawer-cabinet full of them! We will have a blast learning some of her favorite tunes. While we're learning the tunes, let's work on several things to make the songs come alive! We will work on strumming and rhythm and other techniques that make a song go from humdrum to stage worthy.	Over the years David has learned quite a few little tricks that help fill in holes in songs and makes tunes more musical. David will teach a song or two and incorporate these into the songs to show you what you can do to liven up your repertoire.

	Did you know that by changing 1 string to a different note you can up not only your repertoire, but your playing skill level increases as well as your performing and enjoyment of playing jump sky high! We will start in DAD key of D and will work on learning a song in Aeolian and Dorian. Bring a capo if you have one.	Learn the beautiful hymn "How Gracious Are Thy Mercies Lord". The English version of "Star of the County Down" which is in 3/4 time was changed by churches to 4/4 time and some beautiful poetry was added. David will teach this song and then show you how to add some embellishments to fill it out. This is not a hard song and will be a beautiful addition to your repertoire.

Let David show you why he uses left-hand lead in some of his embellishments. David will be teaching a song or two along with this workshop and show you how to add a left-hand lead into the song.
